Born from slavery, developed clandestinely, and banned by authorities until 1981, Maloya today is associated with ancestry and freedom. Expect vibrant singing, swirling dances, and captivating traditional percussion in this uplifting expression of joy and celebration.

Salama is led by Dr. Muriel Hillion, who completed her PhD on Maloya dance and music at the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA). Her research informs the performances, which comprise storytelling, visuals, and songs written and composed by the band to share island rhapsodies in Australia and promote harmony in diversity.


